Frices keep going up, so this voucher really helps. It's one less thing to stress about, and my child can start school with everything they need.

As young people settle back into school, we've got a package of support to help parents.

All children in secondary schools who are eligible for Access for All will now receive a free school meal. Around 800 pupils will benefit, and families will save up to £500 per child, per year.

Our School Uniform Support Scheme has also been expanded. The scheme offers school uniform vouchers for children joining Reception or Year 7. As well as families on free school meals, the offer will now also include all Access for All families.

And we've teamed up with country music legend Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to give every Wandsworth child aged up to five a free book every month. A range of activities and resources will be developed to support the chosen books in our libraries, nurseries and family hubs and will also support reading at home. The project is supported by funds raised by players of People's

Postcode Lottery and delivered by Dolly Parton's charity, The Dollywood Foundation, so will not be a paid for by Wandsworth council tax payers.

Judi Gasser, Cabinet Member for Children, said: "We are committed to supporting Wandsworth families. The School Uniform Support Scheme helps ensure more children can start school feeling confident and ready to learn, while expanding free school meals is an important step in making sure every child has the support they need to thrive.

"We're also beyond excited to be bringing Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to Wandsworth. This programme gives every child the best possible start in life through stories, books, and imagination."

More CCTV to keep Wandsworth safe

We've secured additional funding to significantly boost CCTV, with extended monitoring hours and brand-new mobile CCTV vans.


There are more than 1200 public safety cameras across Wandsworth. They will be monitored an extra 150 hours each month by staff at the town hall Joint Control Centre (JCC) and there will be three new rapidly-deployable Mobile CCTV cars.

The JCC, which is operational 24 hours a day, every day of the year, also acts as a vital lifeline during out-of-hours emergencies including fires, floods, road traffic accidents and housing estate lift breakdowns. In 2024, the JCC logged 62,217 calls.

The extra funding has been made possible from the Neighbourhood Renewal Fund. Wandsworth Council is set to invest £9 million in a wide range of neighbourhood improvements – all part of our Decade of Renewal being paid for by property developers.

Graeme Henderson, Cabinet Member for Health, said: "This extra funding marks a significant step forward in our commitment to keeping Wandsworth safe. We can be more proactive, responsive and visible, ensuring Wandsworth remains the safest Inner London borough for Crime and anti-social behaviour."







A bigger bite of the Apple

A pioneering link up with Apple means even more Wandsworth schoolchildren will benefit from world-class digital learning.

Since the launch of the Apple Schools programme in 2022, twenty Wandsworth primary schools receive world-class technology, professional development for teachers, and innovative teaching tools such as Apple's Everyone Can Create and Everyone Can Code. Most importantly, the initiative is bringing cutting-edge digital skills and tools to many children who might not otherwise have access to such opportunities.

The expansion of the schools programme was announced at the Apple Primary Schools Expo and Showcase at Battersea Arts Centre. Six new schools will come on board, and there will be a new focus on accessibility for children with special educational needs.

Putting libraries first

We love our libraries and we want them to be inclusive, innovative and accessible to all.

Judi Gasser, Cabinet Member for Children's Services, said: "We're incredibly proud that our much-loved and award-winning libraries were some of the highest performing in the country last year, helped along by the opening of our brand-new Wandsworth Town and Northcote libraries, and the refurbishment of Putney Library."

Libraries First! is a five-year plan to put libraries at the heart of local communities.

Expect a trial of longer opening hours, refurbished children's libraries at Balham and Battersea Park, upgraded IT facilities across all libraries, an expanded eBook offer for young people, and extra initiatives such as maths and English tutoring, basic digital skills training and wireless printing.

ballot opens

Residents of the Alton Estate in Roehampton can have their say on the future of their homes and neighbourhood.

We recognise the historical challenges faced by the Alton Estate and are committed to delivering improvements for both current and future generations who make it their home.

Key highlights of the revised proposed masterplan include increased affordable homes, more and better community facilities including new youth spaces, a new library and accessible community hubs, plus a brandnew shopping parade.

A ballot on the masterplan will be open until October 16. Ballot papers were sent out on September 19.

All eligible residents are encouraged to find out more about proposed improvements, and ensure their voices are heard.

Plan to transform the Winstanley

We've given the green light to an improved Winstanley Neighbourhood Regeneration Plan.

Investment includes a new leisure centre, a library and community spaces, as well as green spaces, play areas and facilities such as shops, cafes, restaurants and health centres.

This follows the council's decision to take full control of the Winstanley and York Road estates redevelopment, ending the previous joint venture partnership. Crucially, the change allows the council and residents to move at pace with the next stages of the development following first moves in at Braund Mansions.





We issued 623 Fixed Penalty Notices to flytippers in the first half of this year.

This includes unwanted furniture such as mattresses and chairs left on the side of a residential street, rubble and building waste dumped on a back street, and industrial waste flytipped in a car park.

Our enforcement officers have the power to issue £1,000 on-the-spot Fixed Penalty Notices (FPNs) for


small scale fly-tipping. Large scale fly-tipping can be punished in the Magistrate's Court with a £50,000 fine, and a 12-month prison sentence. Offenders convicted of large-scale fly-tipping in a Crown Court can face an unlimited fine, and/or a five-year prison sentence.

As part of our Cleaner Borough Plan, we have listened to local residents and increased CCTV monitoring in hotspot areas to catch fly-tippers red-handed.

We are serious about tackling flytipping in Wandsworth. Our diligent enforcement teams, which we have reinforced with more staff, have swiftly identified culprits and issued fines.

Wandsworth Town is a great place to live, work and visit. Tell us how we can make it even better


Calling all Wandsworth Town residents. We've opened a survey to find out how we can make it easier to move around Wandsworth Town Centre and listen to what would improve the area for people who live, work, study or spend time there.

The town centre, together with Clapham Junction and Nine Elms, has been identified in the London Growth Plan as a new 'growth corridor' in the borough which is a key strategic area for housing, infrastructure and economic development. In our own Wandsworth Growth Plan, the council has set out plans to unlock inclusive growth with housing, jobs, health and environmental benefits for the whole borough.

As London's South Circular road runs through the centre of Wandsworth Town, the council is working together with TfL to develop options that could improve the town centre's public transport, cycling, walking, accessibility and the public realm around the road, acting on feedback from local residents and businesses.

We have an ongoing programme of infrastucture improvements with new playgrounds and sports facilities, CCTV monitoring, road improvements and support for local community organisations.

This summer, work got underway on three playgrounds and a new multi-use games area is set to open in October in Randall Close.

Carney's Community benefited from council funding to refit and launch their bike workshop, giving young local people vital employment skills and experience.

These improvements are being funded by partners in the borough, acting on feedback from residents gathered at the council's community drop-in events and online surveys. Not a penny will be added to your council tax.



Falcon Bridge upgrade

The Falcon Road rail bridge underpass in Clapham Junction is being redesigned to make it safer, brighter and more welcoming, including new artwork cladding, better lighting, painting, pigeon-proofing and landscaping.



Celebrate our parks

The Mayor of London, Sir Sadiq Khan, officially opened the 32-acre Springfield Park in the heart of Tooting this summer - the largest new park to be created in the capital since 2012.

Pupils from Fircroft Primary School helped unveil a commemorative plaque and plant the park's 700th tree.

The London Mayor was also joined by Wandsworth Council Leader Simon Hogg who said: "Wandsworth is proud to be one of London's greenest boroughs, and Springfield Park is a fantastic addition to our extensive network of parks, commons and open spaces."

We're continuing to invest in our parks to make them the best in London. Other recent highlights include:

- 12 of our parks won a prestigious Green Flag, awarded for parks that hat meet the highest environmental, community and maintenance standards
- A statue of pioneering landscape designer Fanny Wilkinson was installed in Coronation Gardens, Southfields - completing the restoration of the longdormant water fountain

- Iconic statues in Battersea Park, including the war memorial and Three Standing Figures by Henry Moore, have been restored
- A new six-year parks maintenance contract was awarded that emphasises sustainability

Keep warm this winter

Eligible residents will benefit from Warm Home Packs for the third year in a row this winter, as Wandsworth Council continues to deliver the most generous cost-of-living support package in London.

These free packs, distributed in partnership with Crew Energy, are designed to help households reduce energy bills by as much as £240 a year and make homes more comfortable during the colder months. Packs include items such as draught excluding tape and shower timers.

"My Wandsworth Council warm home pack has been a life changer for me," says Roger Leach, 57, a trained chef from Balham. Roger also had a home visit from a member of the team for advice and further financial assistance to support him.

Organised by the Jimmy Asher Foundation and part funded by the MOPAC's Violence Reduction Unit, the event focused on building trust, safety, and a sense of unity among local families and their young people

Wandsworth Council's Community Safety and Children's Services teams went along to promote key safety messages and give information about resources including anonymous crime reporting through Fearless, how to report anti-social behaviour and domestic abuse support including the One Stop Shop.

As we reach the middle of our year as London Borough of Culture, we're celebrating the borough we all call home



Also in October, Wandsworth's incredible community of artists and makers open their homes and studios to the public for the annual Wandsworth Artists' Open House.

In November the Clapham Grand celebrates its 125th anniversary. For one night only on November 26 Palace of Varieties will pay tribute to a century of cultural change, with songs from every decade and tributes to everything from bingo to Britpop and music hall to drag queens.


